

Waste Breakthrough

Preliminary work has started on Australia's first commercial waste-to-resource plant being built at the Hawkesbury City Waste Management Facility at South Windsor.

ARC Ento Tech is building the state-of-the-art plant which aims to convert 85 percent of the waste within the facility into valuable resources.

Hawkesbury City Council is currently working with NSW EPA to attain the required regulatory approvals after the Hawkesbury Planning Panel gave the green light for the installation of the temporary shelters associated with the trial.

The one-year trial will initially process and divert 20 tonnes of putrescible waste per day converting it into fertiliser, biofuel and livestock feed instead of burying it in landfill. It will help extend the life of the waste management facility and reduce methane emissions from food and other organic matter decomposing in the landfill.

The ARC Process[™] developed in Australia uses the black soldier fly larvae to feed on the putrescible waste from the weekly red bin collections and excrete a by-product that can be collected and potentially used or on-sold as a valuable fertiliser. The larvae themselves have the potential to be on-sold as livestock feed at the end of their lifecycle. Residual organic and inorganic by-products are also captured for processing and repurposing as a biofuel. The black soldier fly is not attracted to homes or humans.

Hawkesbury City Mayor Les Sheather said the trial was an innovative addition to council's efforts to reduce waste, to the benefit of all residents. "All current predictions show Greater Sydney's existing landfill capacity will run out by 2030, including the Hawkesbury facility. This is a huge problem for all Sydney councils, not just the Hawkesbury.

"This trial has the potential to extend the life of our landfill, giving our residents greater certainty around the ongoing provision of an affordable and sustainable waste service, but more than that, it has the potential to revolutionise how we manage waste across the country and I'm very proud that Council and our staff are leading the way.

"I look forward to the results of this trial and a positive path forward for our city's waste management," he said.

This project provides solid proof that sustainable waste management is achievable and offers a scalable model that can be adapted by private and government stakeholders worldwide."

He said other councils were looking at the ARC Process[™] technology.

IN DISTRESS

A father and son have been praised by the police for raising the alarm to a man found injured in bushland off Annette Place near Eric Mobbs Reserve at Baulkham Hills.

At 10pm on Tuesday April 22nd the two called for emergency help after hearing cries of distress in the bush. They led Hills police through the bush to locate the person in distress.

A 40-year-old man was found halfsubmerged in a creek, the police were unable to move him without assistance. The father and son who raised the alarm stayed at the scene and police say gave "crucial support" to the emergency responders.

Police called for Fire and Rescue as well as an ambulance. Shortly after, Fire and Rescue teams arrived, followed by paramedics.

With the continued assistance of the two men, the individual was safely transported to the ambulance. Paramedics assessed the individual and transported him home after a full check-up.

Police said: "Thanks to the quick thinking and collaborative efforts of the two men, the police, Fire and Rescue, and paramedics, the individual sustained no injuries and was safely reunited with his family.

"The Hills Police Area Command commends the two men for their invaluable assistance and

dedication to helping a fellow community member in need. Their actions exemplify the spirit of community and the difference we can make when we come together.

"This story serves as a reminder of the strength and compassion within our community, and the vital role each of us can play in ensuring the safety and well-being of our neighbours".

HIGH ON SPEED

A P-Plater will face a hefty fine and disqualification after a police Highway Patrol car clocked him driving at more than double the legal speed limit (107kph in a 50kph zone) just after 1pm on Thursday 17th April. The driver was drug tested and allegedly returned a positive result for cannabis.

STABBING

An 18-year-old has been arrested and charged by Hills detectives for aggravated robbery with wounding and robbery following two knife incidents.

On 10th April at 6.45 pm a16-year-old male was stabbed twice during an altercation and robbery on Softwood Avenue, Kellyville. The victim fled and sought help from a nearby residence, and emergency services were contacted. The victim was treated at Westmead Hospital.

On the evening of April 15th at approximately 8:15pm police say another robbery occurred at Main Street, Rouse Hill Town Centre. The same male suspect is alleged to have approached a 17-year-old male victim and demanded their belongings. The victim was assaulted and had their shoes and backpack taken.

Following a thorough investigation, Hills Detectives identified and arrested the alleged 18-year- old male suspect on April 16th.

HEAD-ON COLLISION

A two-car head-on collision occurred on Glenhaven Rd Near Bannerman Rd around 8.30 pm, Monday, 28th April. Both drivers were taken to hospital with minor injuries and precautionary scans. Emergency crews attended the scene and cleared the roadway.

On the same day a car crashed on Samantha Riley Drive at Beaumont Hills.

There were a number of crashes locally.

It was lucky there were no serious injuries following a multi vehicle crash (pictured below) at the intersection of Old Northern Rd and Hastings Rd, Castle Hill on Thursday 24th April. Emergency crews responded on-site to clear the area. Police say the persons involved only had minor injuries.

On Tuesday 22nd April, a man driving a vintage yellow Volkswagen Beetle luckily escaped serious injury following a rollover crash in the wet on Wisemans Ferry Road, Cattai, at the cross of Post Office Road at around 1pm. The driver was taken to the hospital for observations.

Police urge drivers to be extra cautious when driving in rainy conditions as wet roads can be slippery due to oil and other substances.

- Check your tyres. Ensure they have good tread and are properly inflated.
- Slow down. Reduce your speed to maintain better control.
- Increase following distance. Give yourself more time to react.
- Slow down, stay alert, and drive safe.



ROAD RAGE ARREST

A man has been arrested and charged with assault and theft following a road rage incident on County Drive at Cherrybrook at around 8.20am on Wednesday, 30th April 2025.

The incident involved a grey BMW X5 and a white Volkswagen Golf which were both traveling south on County Drive, approaching the right turn lane onto Woodgrove Avenue.

The female driver alleges that the 42 yearold male driver began yelling and showing signs of road rage. She started recording the male driver, who then exited his vehicle.

She told police that as she began to drive away, the male driver followed on foot, leaned into her vehicle through the front passenger window, and demanded her phone. It will be alleged he then took her car keys.

The male driver returned to his car with the keys, and the female driver attempted to retrieve them, leading to a physical altercation. A witness arrived, recorded the interaction, and contacted emergency services.

The male driver drove to Castle Hill Police Station, where he handed over the car keys, and was subsequently arrested and charged with assault and stealing.

The matter is now before Parramatta Local Court on the 18th June.

Police are appealing to anyone with information about the incident or dash cam footage to contact Crime Stoppers NSW on 1800 333 000. All information is treated with the utmost confidentiality.

DRINK DRIVING

At approximately 1:10am on Friday, 18th April, police were patrolling south on Windsor Road, Kellyville. During this time, a 28-year-old male was initially observed committing a traffic

Offence. Police stopped the vehicle and a roadside breath test was conducted, which returned a positive reading. The driver was subsequently arrested and taken to Castle Hill Police Station for a breath analysis, which returned a reading of 0.115 grams of alcohol in 210 litres of breath. He was charged with mid-range drink driving and his licence was suspended.

SWITCHEROO

On 17 April, a vehicle pulled up short of an RBT site on Schofields Rd, Schofields, Police say they observed the driver and passenger swap seats before proceeding to the site.

The 24-year-old male seated in the passenger seat made full admissions to driving the vehicle and swapping seats with his female passenger. The male was found to be disqualified from driving until 2039 and was subsequently charged.

JOHN EBBOTT OAM BY BEV JORDAN

The Hills is mourning the death of community stalwart John Ebbott OAM with tributes pouring in from the many organisations he served during 40 years and more of volunteering.

A guard of honour from the Rural Fire Service and Lions Clubs will be at his funeral on Monday, 5th May at Castlebrook Memorial Park, Rouse Hill. The service will start at 11am.

John, 74, spent 25 years co-ordinating the running of the Crestwood Community Fair at Baulkham Hills, part of the annual Orange Blossom Festival, and was also on the Hills Council Australia Day Committee for many years.

He was a Rural Fire Service volunteer for decades and spent 12 years as community liaison with the CareFlight rescue organisation and 30 years volunteering with Crestwood Lions which he helped establish. He also co-founded the Crestwood Leos club and was a Life member of APEX.

He was a scout leader and the voice of Crestwood Fair as its MC.

Social media was flooded with tributes to John following his death on April 22 and with condolences to his wife Kathy and sons Phil and Neil.


Hills Shire Mayor Michelle Byrne dedicated a Mayoral Minute at Tuesday's meeting to John's extensive community involvement. "In 2024, John received the Medal of the Order of Australia. While he may not have sought recognition for his many achievements, those of us who knew him always understood the depth of his impact on our community. John's legacy is one of tireless service, community spirit."

John was part of the RFS The Hills Communications and Schofields Brigade and just a few weeks ago, while in hospital he was given another RFS honour, Life Member of Hills Communication Brigade. It was the last of many honours John received.

The Brigade said John's community service left "a significant mark" on numerous organisations and individuals.

"He was a highly active volunteer firefighter for many years, serving with dedication in several brigades including Kenthurst (2006-2013), North Rocks (2013-2023), and Schofields (2017-2025). One of John's proudest contributions to the RFS was his role with The Hills Communications (2004 to 2025). He was Brigade President (2005-2014) Deputy Captain (2007-2025) and Brigade Training Officer (2013-2024).

"His commitment to protecting the community through the NSW Rural Fire Service, particularly during the challenging 2019-2020 bushfire season, earned him numerous accolades, including the National Emergency Medal, NSW Premier's Bushfire Emergency Citation, the RFS Long Service Medal and the National



TO AFRICA WITH LOVE BY BEV JORDAN

Ruth Pasi from Box Hill. has dedicated her life to caring for children in need. With six children of her own, Ruth has also fostered two additional children and, eleven years ago, started a special program for troubled youth.

Through her African Theatres organisation, Ruth has taken a total of 46 teenagers to Zimbabwe for three weeks to show them how children on the other side of the world live.

Ruth fundraises tirelessly all year and uses money she earns as an Uber driver to add to the necessary funds. She is now planning her sixth trip in November this year 2025, with the hope of taking up to 15 teenagers, depending on how much she can raise.

"We stay on a farm about 60kms from Harare," Ruth says.

During their stay, the teenagers help on the farm and visit a local orphanage, spending time with the children.

Ruth believes this trip breaks barriers and changes lives. "It's a journey," she says. "Some children we take to Africa don't have a lot of hope. This trip is therapy and healing. I take a child to Africa, and it changes them."

Ruth has witnessed the profound transformation in kids who are at a very low point in their lives, skipping school, suffering from eating disorders, feeling depressed and even suicidal.

"When they interact with the children they meet every day in Africa, they change. The smiles, the laughter, and the bonds formed create a ripple effect of hope and healing," she says.

Josh aged 17 says: "This trip to Africa was life-changing. I was feeling lost and hopeless, but meeting the children there and seeing their resilience gave me a new perspective on life. I came back with a renewed sense of purpose."

Amber, 18: "Helping on the farm and spending time with the kids at the orphanage made me realise how fortunate I am. It was a humbling experience that taught me the value of gratitude and compassion."

Kelly, 15, "I was struggling with depression and skipping school before the trip. But interacting with the children in Africa and seeing their joy despite their circumstances inspired me to make positive changes in my own life."

Chanel, 21: "This trip truly healed me in ways I never imagined."

One of the most inspiring success stories from Ruth's past trips is that of Corey, a teenager who was feeling lost and hopeless before the journey. Corey had been struggling with depression and skipping school, but the trip to Africa changed everything. Corey returned home with a renewed sense of purpose and hope.

The fundraising is all year round to enable more children to attend. Ruth says: "Every contribution, big or small, makes a significant impact and brings hope and healing to these young lives."

Thousands of people will be walking the track at Castle Hill Showground on Saturday May 17th, united in their determination to raise funds for cancer research and support programs.

There will be all day entertainment on stage plus trackside activities including a huge inflatable dartboard and basketball hoop plus activations by Alive 90.5, tug of war, box car rally and decorated hat parade.

There are more than 70 teams registered to take part in the 24-hour event which starts at 9.30am on Saturday with the final lap at 0.30am

on Sunday. Participants can walk as many laps as they want and stay for as long as they want.


The Bromeliad Society of Australia Inc

The Hills **Club**

Nestled away in the Fred Caterson Reserve sits the relatively unknown Hills Offroad RC track. For the past 50 years this track has seen 1/10th scale electric radio control cars race for fun as well as for the glory of a championship win.

The Hills Offroad is one of the best offroad RC tracks in Australia offering a 225m track with plenty of challenging bends and hills that need to be conquered in the fastest time possible. From the 3m drivers' ramp, the drivers have a bird's eye view of their car and the track as they race. It is fast and furious, and it is not uncommon to see the cars flip over or leave the track, with volunteers on the track quickly turning the cars over so the race can continue.

It is a hobby that appeals to many, and it is one that is taken very seriously by those looking to compete Nationally and Internationally to become World Champion. In April, this year the Hills Offroad RC hosted the pre-world warm up event which bought together competitors from across Australia and from overseas. Local man, Lachlan Donelly took out the title, ensuring a shot at the World Titles in September which will also be hosted in Castle Hill. For the Hills Offroad RC Club, hosting the World Championships is a shot in the arm for the Club and will put the Club and the Hills on the map. The World Championships will be a lot larger than the warm-up event and will bring together even more competitors from across the globe and nationally to compete for the ultimate World Championship Title.

Outside of the Club Championships and the World Championships, the Hills Offroad RC club races every 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month from 9am to 4pm. Everyone is welcome to join in regardless of racing experience and novice drivers are always welcome at the Club.

Outside of racing days, the track is open every day of the week for residents wishing to race their 1/10th electric cars (or smaller).

There is no doubt that the Hills Offroad RC track, set in the picturesque Fred Caterson is one of the prettiest tracks across Australia and

Playwright Alex Dennison is a man with a mission.


It's been one year since the Broadway debut of his then fiancé, Monica Welles. A debut which ended in tragedy when her body was found in her apartment, an apparent suicide.

MEMORIES WITH IVOR JONES & FRIENDS

A CAR OR A BOAT

Way back during the 1960s I saw a news item on the television news that intrigued me. The item featured a vehicle driving into Sydney Harbour and then floating amongst the yachts and other vessels on the harbour. What a great innovation I thought.

A memory of that item came to me whilst on a bus tour of the Snowy Mountains of NSW. During a visit to the Cooma Car Club in November 2022 I actually saw the "Amphicar", the vehicle that featured in the news item.

The origins of this amphibious vehicle can be traced back to WW2. Hans Trippel, an engineer and member of the NAZI party, came up with the idea of producing such a vehicle as part of the NAZI war machine. Using the facilities of Volkswagen he produced the Volkswagen Schwimmwagen of which only around 200 were produced.

After the war Trippel served two years imprisonment after being sentenced during the "denazification" of Germany, after which he decided to try to perfect his idea of an amphibious vehicle.

In 1961, the first "Amphicars" were manufactured and manufacturing continued until 1965. During that period, 3,878 amphibious cars were produced. Although its numbers



might be modest, the "Amphicar" remains the only civilian amphibious passenger automobile ever to be mass-produced to date.

The "duckboat" tourist vehicles seen in coastal cities around the world also descended from the Amphicar. Unfortunately, the growing number of accidents involving these hybrid tourism vehicles, which typically carry upwards of 30 passengers at once, has made their continued use controversial.

Though it's almost 60 years now since the last Amphicar was made, these unique vehicles continue to charm collectors. Perhaps this quirky car that turns into a boat could still inspire an amphibious vehicle revolution in the future.

The United States was the only country where the Amphicar could claim to have achieved success. The most famous Amphicar owner was none other than, then US President, Lyndon B. Johnson, who used his hybrid car to play practical jokes on guests, as journalist Robert Sempler divulged in a 1965 profile of the president:

"The scenario is familiar now. An unsuspecting guest is lured into Amphicar. President says they're going for a little spin.

President heads for water. Guest cries, 'Hey, you're going into the water!' President flips a lever that locks doors, prevents leakage. Car hits water with a whoosh. Guest gasps, then realizes he isn't sinking. Color returns to face, and he and President go putt-putting along at about 5 knots."

President Johnson's pranks using his amphibious car were so well known that they were even included in the HBO film All The Way starring Bryan Cranston as the president. But the "Amphicar" wasn't just used for presidential pranks.

According to enthusiast website, Amphicar. com, the amphibious car was also marketed as a specialty vehicle for emergency rescue services. The American Red Cross deployed a number of "Amphicars" to serve flood danger areas. But as the decade came to a close, the novelty of the boat-car hybrid vessel began to wear off.

A number of factors led to the failure of the amphibious vehicle which include -

- First, the infrastructure needed to support the amphibious car's unique capabilities simply didn't exist. In order for the driver of an Amphicar to launch their vehicle into the water, there needed to be sufficient space, like a proper ramp. These kinds of setups were limited.
- 2. There was the amphibious car's confusing identity. While the water-riding vehicle enjoyed some degree of attention due to its dual function, the marketing for it was unclear. Was it a car or was it actually a boat? This muddled messaging may have cost Amphicar potential customers.
- 3. Though compact, the Amphicar was also a high-maintenance automobile. After five hours in the water, the engine needed to be greased – which could only be done by lifting the entire car and taking out the rear seats. Exposure to saltwater made it vulnerable to erosion, so it needed to be frequently cleaned thoroughly with fresh water.

Will anyone else float the idea of amphibious vehicles, I wonder?


